Exhibitions by Members - January

Felicity Robinson is exhibiting at **Parks Café** during January. **Park's Cafe**, has space for 8-12 pictures depending on size. Park's Cafe has supported Droitwich Arts Network for a number of years. Artists provide their details so that members of the public can purchase pictures if they wish.

Sheena Howarth is displaying paintings at **The Button Tree, Tagwell Road; The Button Tree has** space for 3 artworks. This is an ideal venue for artists who want to try exhibiting their work without feeling the pressure to make sales and there's no charge!



Fran Higginson will show 8, and **Rosie Philpott** will show 12 paintings **at the Corbett Medical Centre, Corbett Avenue** where artists have a choice of rooms. History in the Making is a year-long programme of creative activities celebrating Worcestershire's rich heritage and the voices of underrepresented communities. It will result in a published anthology, joint visual arts and poetry exhibitions and a poetry map of Worcester's key community spaces. Art House Open Lecture - Marcus Coates



Tue, 23 Jan 2024 17:00 - 18:30 GMT at The Art House, University of Worcester Castle Street Worcester WR1 3HN

Hosted at the Art House, Worcester the lecture series offers a unique opportunity to hear firsthand from some of the most exciting contemporary artists currently making work in the UK. The talks offer the opportunity to engage in thought-provoking dialogues with the artists (via a Q&A), connect with Worcestershire's artistic community, and gain an understanding of

artistic processes and influences.

Marcus Coates attempts to understand how we relate to each other and the implications of this for the world around us. His work is often motivated by the need for change, with a social and ecological impact in mind. He works with others to create processes founded on empathy and trust, collaborating with members of the public, organisations and institutions, as well as experts from a wide range of disciplines including; anthropologists, ornithologists, wildlife sound recordists, choreographers, politicians, psychiatrists, palliative care consultants, musicians, and primatologists amongst others.

Coates was nominated for the 4th Plinth Commission in 2014 and was the recipient of a Paul Hamyln Award in 2008. In 2014 he was the first recipient of the James Lovelock Commission and in 2009 he won the inaugural Daiwa Art Prize. If you are unable to join us in-person, this event will be live streamed via zoom. If you wish to attend this event online, please book an online ticket.

Droitwich Wind Instrument Group (DWIG)





We move on with hope and gratitude for the next day's sunrise.




Jacqui Cashmore sent in these lovely pictures and says "The Schnauzer sketch/ painting was a Christmas gift




