What's On in Worcestershire

Broadway Arts Festival: the Broadway Arts Festival which is coming up from **Friday 9**th **to Sunday 18**th **June**.

Over 80 events of highest quality across 10 days at some pretty special venues in and around the beautiful Cotswold village of Broadway.

We have a host of fabulous artists running <u>30+ workshops</u> across the 10 days including Haidee-Jo Summers, Penny German, Vicki Norman, Georgina Potter and Jenny Aitken (Oils), Shelley Rhodes, Tim Fisher, Tansy Hargan (Sketchbooks/Sketching), Paul Talbot-Greaves (acrylics) and Gareth Jones (Pastels). There is also a wide choice of hands- on creative workshops



ranging from picture framing, jewellery, ceramics and even stone carving- plus many more!

You may be particularly interested in our <u>demonstrations</u> planned for the first 3 days of the festival: These can be combined during a day visit with <u>'artBEAT'</u> which showcases 40+ of Britain's top artists & designers demonstrating their skills and selling their work in the marquees on our village green.

We also have the <u>Great Broadway Paint-Off</u> on Sunday 18th June where artists from across the country spend the day in the village competing for great prizes (and kudos!). There is then a selling exhibition of the entries for all to enjoy at the end of the afternoon.

On top of all this - the festival has broader appeal with superb live music, outdoor theatre at Broadway Tower, dance and family events. Find a full list of all events here.

Stitch and textile art group Threads, will host an exhibition, My Happy Place throughout 2023 at Croome in Worcestershire. Artist Wayne Warren takes over The Commandery in Worcester with contemporary art interventions in the exhibition Aspire starting Saturday 1 April to Sunday 3 September 2023. The exhibition is themed around aspiration, dreams and ambition, and aims to provide a twenty-first century response to the historic site.



Worcester City Museum and Art Gallery: One of the largest global collections of rare Titanic and White Star Line artifacts is to be showcased in a national touring exhibition which sails into Worcester City Art Gallery and Museum this month.

In addition to viewing props and costumes from James Cameron's iconic 1997 film, Titanic: Honour & Glory will enable visitors to discover personal stories, experience

the grandeur of transatlantic travel and step back into the gilded age via examples of the ship's luxurious interior fittings.

There will also be a moving display enlightening visitors about Worcestershire's connection to the sinking of the Titanic. Titanic: Honour & Glory will show at Worcester City Art Gallery and Museum **from 17 May until 11 September.**

Before I started writing I would sit and read, and think, and watch a YouTube video, and sit and read, and listen to a podcast and I would the sit and read again... it became a repeated cycle of me constantly listening to motivational videos or reading motivational materials but I was not working on my own dream.

To be honest, I didn't know where to start. How do I start this online business that I really want to work on? Where do I find the targeted audience that will follow my dream? What business do I really want to start right now? I was in my 30's and in a professional health career but I was not happy. Deep down in my heart I knew that I was supposed to help people in a different way. I wanted clarity and guidance on how I could start this dream of having my own business online but seriously I did not know how to do it. However, I was nowhere close to achieving my dream of starting a business because I had not started anything. Instead, all my time was spent on constantly buying motivational online classes, prosperity books, watching videos and podcasts and forever telling myself that one day I would start my own online business. So, what was the secret to starting my own online business?

'Action'

Action to start on writing content.

Action to start an Instagram page.

Action to create creative visual posts.

It took the action of me just starting. Picking up that pen and paper and start writing. Not thinking about whether the content I was creating was perfect or not but deciding right there and then that I would learn along the way.

So here I am, creating this blog for you as I write.

And you can too.

Here are Three Ways to help you on your journey of taking action.

1. Planning

Keep a notebook and plan your day every night before you go to bed. It only takes 5 minutes of your time to write down what you are going to do the next day and this simple act will help you to get closer to your goal. By planning your day before bed, your subconscious mind will automatically register the most important tasks that you need to have done tomorrow.

Remember the 80/20 rule. 20% of your effort in importing 10 products on your website or writing a 500-word blog will yield 80% of results. But in order to achieve that, you need to plan your day for tomorrow and that takes less than 5 minutes.

2. Wake up early the next morning

One of the best productivity hacks is waking up early the next day. The most successful people are usually early risers because they say that at that time of the morning the brain is usually more alert and there is more clarity on what they're going to do next. Unfortunately, many of us have a hard time of waking up an hour or two earlier, and our bodies have not adapted to getting out of that sleep mode fast. One of the things you can do to help your brain wake up to drink a full glass of water. Drinking water as soon as you wake up will quickly rehydrate the body and wakes the brain up into productive mode. Or another tip you can do to wake you up the next day is to command the brain before you go to sleep to wake up at a certain time the next day. The brain is a very powerful organ and it will listen to your command.

3. Don't talk about doing your task to anyone the next day

What happens is that if you talk to your colleague or friend about whatever task you are supposed to be working on, you will psychologically feel good about the task that you haven't started yet and your brain will automatically think you have already done it. For most people that has a negative impact on their bodies because now that they feel like they have already done the task, they will not feel like implementing it when it is time to do it.

I was in constant bragging mode of telling my friends about the website I was going to start or the article I was going to write, but when I got home, I never started it. So, the best way to cease that habit is to say nothing until the task is actually done. Until you get your mindset to a state of producing the work even after you have spoken or told someone about it, it is best my friend to keep it to yourself.



Achieving an outcome with good composition, tonal range, interest for the viewer, depth and balance in a limited time frame, where the outcome can't be fully predetermined, is fun as you have to make yourself relinquish a certain amount of control and go with the materials in the moment. Plans can be made and controls put in place, but results can't be guaranteed! You never know quite what you'll get, so it keeps it exciting and sometimes exasperating! "
