The DAN Mini ArtsFest 2023 – 16th September

As most of you will know by now DAN is hosting a mini-ArtsFest in our NEW Hub on Saturday 16th September 2023. There will be lots of creativity and entertainment during the day. You will see posters on public notice



boards and A frames throughout the town and on the Old Cock notice board. So, we hope most of Droitwich will now have no excuse not to visit! The festivities will start off with the Town Crier announcing and promoting activities throughout the day. There will be music by DAN members in or just outside the Hub and to continue with the musical theme, the **Droitwich Spa Community** Choir, will be performing a wide range of songs including a Beatles medley, there will be artists demonstrating in the Hub windows all day. As part of the ArtsFest, there will be another 'Dabble Day', similar to the successful event DAN held in the Westlands with all forms of art: knitting, crochet, clay modeling, painting (acrylics/ watercolour / oils), origami, pastels, poetry, music – you name it! Then last but not least, the **DAN Poetry Competition** will be launched during **ArtsFest** with the theme of **"Feare Me Not"** (for those who are not overly familiar with Shakespeare, the title is a quotation from Laertes in Hamlet) to link with the celebration of the 400th anniversary of the printing of Shakespeare 's First Folio by Droitwich born John Heminges friend of Shakespeare and who, together with Henry Condell printed the First Folio containing 36 of Shakespeare's plays including some which had never been printed before and could have been lost for ever. **Alison Jean Lester**, a published writer and member of DAN has kindly offered to judge this competition and has generously offered a prize too. The competition is open to all age groups.

Business Tips for Artists

Sourced From The Fine Art Guild Journal Art Business Today. Professional artist Julie Cross offers her advice. "Don't underprice your work would be my advice, and make sure that your pricing is consistent across all your galleries and other outlets. Most artists sell the majority of their work in the area where they live, so focus on quoting prices that would work locally. Selling work for higher prices in London, for example, will damage your reputation and is a short-term approach. Go round exhibitions, look at work that is similar to yours, and where the artists are at similar points in their careers to you, and see what they are charging. I've seen work for sale at prices that can barely cover the cost of framing, which is unsustainable." Information provided for members of DAN by **Stephen Evans.**
